I. INTRODUCTION

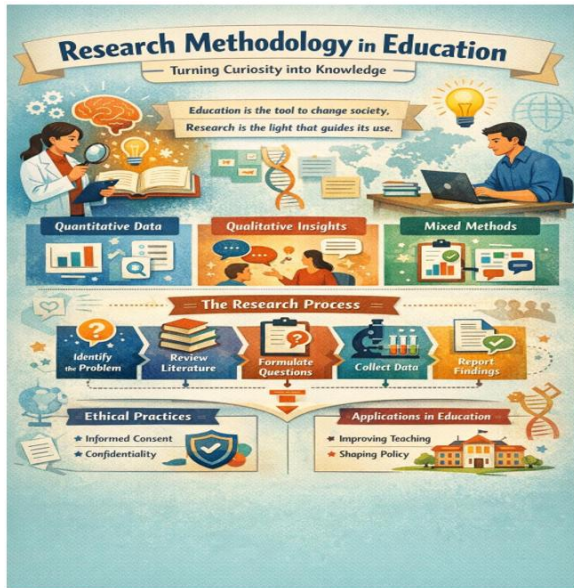
