Graphical Representation of Analytical Focus Areas

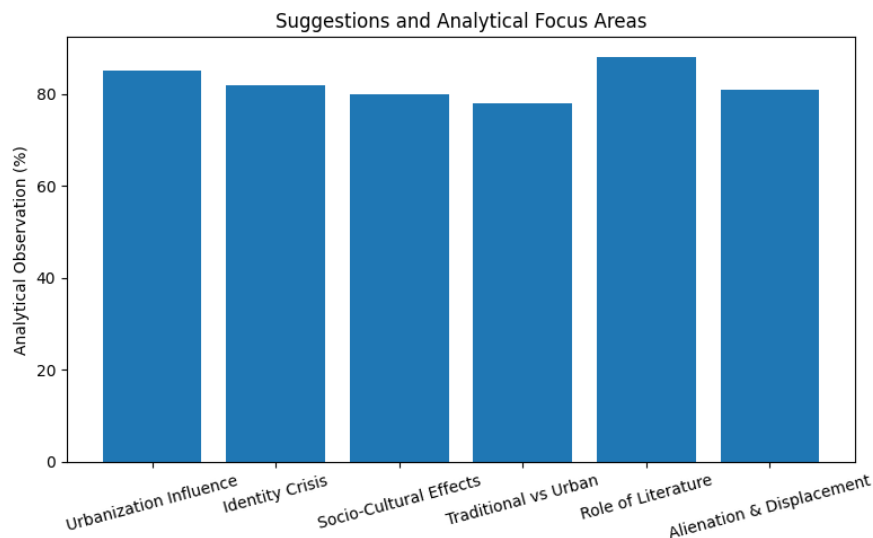


Figure: Analytical representation based on major objectives of the study.
